All locks except tidewater lock (which was wood) were of granite. There were several feeders, not navigable. A 5 span aqueduct was at uxbridge, wood trough. Property owners today, check with DNR in some areas. Possible P.& W. Railroad also. Sections of canal in very good condition north of Providence, some dry, some well watered. Certain sections considered for parks. See reports of DNR (Mass.) as of 1971-74. The Millbury area had some locks 90-126 ft. Whether this was a change in structure later or during construction is not known. No one has been able to account for the total of 62 locks to date. Locally, we would to know where the other 13 locks were built. More research may clear that situation. | |
